

From the Pastor's Desk...

Friends,

When I interviewed with the Pastor Nominating Committee five years ago, I asked them what, in the last few years, this church was most proud of in its life together. One of their main celebrations was the installation of the Centennial Organ in 2013. We have now gotten to enjoy that beautiful instrument for a decade, through the wonderful gifts of Joseph Jackson, our Director of Music Ministries and Organist. Many faithful saints generously contributed to make the installation of the organ possible. And I know that those contributions have helped many of you to feel a deeper connection to our church's music ministry and to the sound of praising God in this place.



We now have a new opportunity to strengthen our individual connections to our church's music program, as well as our relationships with young people in our community. **The Choral Scholar program**, which will be entering its fourth year this fall, brings talented high school and college-age musicians to our Chancel Choir where they receive mentoring from our talented music staff. Our church receives the beauty of their voices added to the choir in worship each week, as well as the joy of knowing them as individuals. The Scholars receive a small stipend for their participation.

As other sources of funding are expiring, our church feels called to raise funds to extend the Choral Scholar program into the future. Can you join this effort to help us ensure we retain Choral Scholars for at least two more years?

On **Sunday, May 7 at 1pm** we hope you will join us for **a fundraising concert** in the sanctuary, featuring our Chancel Choir soloists and current Choral Scholars. Beforehand, we hope you can come to a **special Celebration Brunch** beginning around 11:30am, for a suggested donation. Please sign up for the brunch **https://www.signupgenius.com/go/8050d4fafad2ca7fd0-choral** or at the reception desk. You can make a gift of any size to support the Choral Scholar program at the concert or mail it to the church ahead of time.

An unanticipated celebration of the Choral Scholar program has also been the opportunity to share God's grace with these young people who are hearing the Word proclaimed and sung each Sunday. Some have their own church homes. Others were unaware that churches could be an inclusive, welcoming place for people like them. Some Scholars have shared with me how they have come to understand God's love for them in a new way through their participation at FPCRO. That is a testament to the hospitality you offer and the way you enact God's grace each day. While the goal of the program is not membership in our church, we have been able to play a part in sharing the good news of God's grace with these students. As they go out into the world, who knows how they may encounter God in the future or what small role we may have played in opening each of them to the presence of the Spirit in their own lives?!

A few years from now, I hope that many in our church will lift up the Choral Scholar program as something that they are most proud of in the life of our congregation. Perhaps what we feel will be even more than pride, but something more like gratitude: Gratitude for the commitment and growth of the Scholars. Gratitude for the relationships that have blossomed among the Scholars, choir, and church members. Gratitude for this special way to praise God, to share our faith, and to support young people as they live into their vocations.

CEREAL FOR SUMMER STARTS JUNE 4

enough to eat. FPCRO will support the Cereal for Summer campaign at the Presbytery of Detroit again this year. **During the month of June**, bring a box or two of cereal to be donated through our regional Presbytery to help kids and families in need.

GIVING THANKS FOR OPERATION PAPERBACK

Our church's ministry with Operation Paperback is coming to an end.

Operation Paperback was a project to collect paperback books, and puzzle and game books to send to United States military service members around the world. At this time, with the rise in e-readers and other changes, the demand for physical books is diminishing. So this is an opportunity to bring this mission to a close. We give thanks for a long mission that blessed many service members around the world, as well as members of our congregation who led it and participated.

For the last five years, Don and Adair Calder have led the effort to collect, sort, and mail boxes of books to U.S. armed services members and families. For the 14 years prior to that, Dave and Tillie Nelson spearheaded this ministry. For nearly 20 years, FPCRO has supported those who are serving and may have little access to recreation, movies, or reading material. This includes countless hours of volunteering and many trips to the post office to learn the ins and outs of overseas mailing!

In the last four years, we have sent 421 boxes, which held 9,705 books. We spent about \$4,000 in postage supplies to mail them, which was funded by our church's Hands-On Mission Fund. Prior to that, the Nelson's sent over 41,000 books. We are also grateful for the support of those in the church library over the years: Vicki Dickinson, Liz Mercer, Bev Moss, and Carol Weber. Thank you to all these folks for your faithful ministry!

Choral Scholars Into the Future



This program, which bring high school students into the Chancel Choir, has brought new energy to our choir, enhanced our worship, and created a place of welcome and support for these fine young people. We hope you will consider adding your support for the future of the Choral Scholar Program and that you will join us for a brunch and fundraising concert of beautiful music on May 7 at 1pm.

The Earla Smith Foundation offers funding to experimental programs for up to three years. As funding for Choral Scholars expires ahead of the 2023-24 year, **our goal is to raise \$18,000 to fund the program for the coming two years**. Each Scholar receives \$2,000 to sing with the choir for its season from September through mid-June. Additional funds cover taxes and potential extra services.

RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

From Joseph M. Murphy, Royal Oak Director of Planning: The City of Royal Oak has contracted with Legal Aid and Defender Association (LADA) of Detroit to help keep low- to moderate-income Royal Oak renters from being evicted for non-payment. Renters may be eligible for free financial assistance for unpaid rent and associated late fees, penalties, court costs, etc. dating back no more than six (6) months. Charlotte is a first grader at Jane Addams Elementary in Royal Oak. Her favorite part about school is that she "has a lot of nice friends."


