### From the Pastor's Desk...

#### Friends,

The elders and leaders of the church often feel God calling us in particular directions. But they themselves are not always the specific people equipped to take us there. And very often, people sitting in the pews have the gifts and interest to do things the leadership never expected.

I want to invite more dialogue among leaders, church members, and friends about this dynamic.

- Do you have an idea or passion for ministry that you are dreaming about?
- Do you want to do more to serve God, but aren't quite sure where your gifts fit in this place?



• Are you ready to take on a specific, short-term project at church, even though you aren't ready for a long-term commitment to serve as an Elder or Deacon?

If your answer is YES (or even maybe!) to any of these questions, please be in touch with me, or with a member of Session (their pictures are all on the board outside the reception office.)

The leadership also has several ministries that we feel our congregation is called to, but we're not sure who God is calling to lead them. And we know we cannot do those projects unless they have a leader, a champion, someone to get things going! If you have an interest, skill, or excitement about any of the following, I would love to hear from you so we could think about the next steps.

- Our church would love to have a presence at a local street festival (which doesn't have to be Arts, Beats, and Eats—probably better to start small!). Our vision is to create a quiet, shaded space that can offer a little rest stop, especially for parents with young children. We're looking for someone who could coordinate the logistics of this outreach from securing a spot, gathering supplies/equipment (church funding would be available), being present to set-up, and organizing volunteers to help.
- We are always looking to plug more deeply into South Oakland Citizens for the Homeless, which includes the Welcome Inn, housed at Starr Presbyterian Church (at 13 Mile Road and Crooks in Royal Oak). There are opportunities for our church to host meals throughout the season at their shelter, and having a point person to regularly coordinate those meals would be a gift to the program's guests, and to our church.
- Our children's ministry is growing, which is such a celebration! To abide by our safety policies and to ensure a nurturing environment for all the kids, we are seeking a few more folks who can minister to children roughly once a month either in the nursery, the preschool, or the elementary Sunday school class. Or even teaching our twice-a-month middle school discussion class. If this is you, contact me or Joelle Jarrait.

We'd love to match more congregation members' gifts with the church's ministries. And I also would love to be surprised about other ideas you have for possible ministries and outreach.



Ministers will lead a Service of Healing and Wholeness. We invite you to come as we seek God's comfort and healing during these times.



Our Sunday school advent season begins **November 26**. Lessons will continue to follow the same scriptures as the worship service.






#### Family Worship December 24

invited to take part as we share the story of Jesus' birth for all to hear. During November, Ms. Joelle will talk with children and parents to determine a part for everyone.



#### FALL BOOK DISCUSSION

On **November 8 at 7pm**, we'll meet in the Fireside Room to talk about *Filled to be Emptied: The Path to Liberation for Privileged People* by Brandan J. Robertson. Buy a copy of the paperback book, or read it on your Kindle. This book is part Bible study, part invitation to selfreflection, and part theological work. Robertson traces the Kenosis



Hymn—a short passage in the book of Philippians 2:5-11—which describes the way Christ emptied himself of power to become humble in service to God. Readers are invited to consider how we can choose humility by thinking differently about the various privileges we carry. The book touches on race and poverty, among other issues, and is an invitation to people across the spectrum to faithfully consider our own lives in relation to our wider community. All classes will celebrate Thanksgiving later this month, followed by no school on


November 22-24 as we celebrate Thanksgiving with our families. A very blessed Thanksgiving to our church family, as well!
