### From the Pastor's Desk...

Friends,

In a Prayers of the People last month, I used the descriptor "Patient" to refer to God: Patient God. God is willing and able to work slowly for good outcomes, knowing that they are being revealed. God accompanies us in our faith without growing weary, angry, or frustrated with us. It's a characteristic I wish to embrace, but am often not very good at. As I look at our life together, I am thinking about how patience can help ground us through a chaotic time. Patience has something to do with taking the long view; being willing to stick with a project not knowing exactly what the outcome will be; and with trusting other people to play their part in the bigger picture.



This month, one of our remaining 5F fellowship groups celebrated that they have been together for 20 years, having formed in October 2005. The groups were originally formed around people gathering monthly for 'the 5F's': faith, friendship, fun, fellowship, food. When the groups formed, no one could imagine the relationships, challenges, and joys those groups would share together. Though we have since taken to other ways of connecting people, the enduring legacy of 5Fs shows the fruits of sustained commitment. Through the patience of years, and the commitment of participants, three of those groups still meet for support, prayer, and connection in Christ.

In much more recent history, we have been planting seeds through our family ministry, hoping that they would grow. Today, we see them sprouting and getting stronger. Our weekly Sunday school activities strengthen our kids in faith. The Sunburst Singers program supports faith and music development. Vacation Bible School is a ministry to church children as well as a great outreach. The Backyard Playroom blesses young children and their caregivers. Families continue to visit with us on Sundays and report that you truly welcome them with open arms. Through patient efforts and God's grace, new families are continuing to arrive and choosing to stay to grow in faith here.

This fall, we are excited to share the Building Hope capital campaign with the whole congregation. I hope you'll join us as we reveal the vision for our church and for this campaign at a **special coffee hour on Sunday, October 5**. The campaign team, staff, and I have been working for many months on the campaign already. As with any big project, I wonder if the response will be as robust as the energy and joy in our congregation. Yet the call to patience reminds me that I can trust in God's unhurried and gentle work. I can trust in the people who are hearing of the campaign and getting behind it with their excitement and their pledges. And I know that this project is one small piece of all that God is doing—moment by moment—to reveal the kingdom among us.







### MEN'S CONTEMPLATIVE GROUP





Below is a suggested list of non-perishable items which may be dropped off during church office hours. For cash or check donations, please indicate the "Little Free Pantry" on the check or note. Pull-Tab Cans: stew (beef and chicken), fruit (cocktails, peaches, pears, etc.), vegetables (corn, green beans, peas, etc.), baked beans, soup (any variety), beefaroni/ravioli (ready-to-eat), canned tuna, chicken, or turkey. Non-perishables: granola bars (soft/chewy, any flavor), cereal (small individual boxes), tuna/chicken (ready-to-eat pouches), Knorr rice/pasta sides, peanut butter, snack crackers/cookies, small bottled waters, juice boxes, Easy Mac and Cheese (pouches/cups).
