# From the Pastor's Desk...

Two new seasons are almost upon us at the church. Thinking about these seasons helps me feel excited about the rest of this tough, cold, COVID winter that has been so much harder than we had hoped. I hope you'll join me and the rest of our church family in worship and in the other activities that heighten the meaning of our spiritual lives.

We're settling into our pattern of enjoying the stewardship season during February. And I do mean enjoying it. I love stewardship season because it invites us to think so fully about all that God has given us. And, as is our



practice here, we get to hear from one another about why we give and how we live out our faith. Those personal connections are everything. Our relationships deepen as we share and hear those stories. This year, we have the treat of hearing not from just one person each week, but from a bunch. We'll be enjoying short, person-in-the-pew (like person-on-the-street) videos each week in worship to hear from many church members about why they love this church, what they are willing to 'dig deeper' for, and what legacy they want to leave. I felt honored to hear each person's ideas and I bet you will love watching them in this engaging format, too.



Lent begins March 4 and takes us to Easter on April 17. But I want to invite you to get ready for it during February, by purchasing our devotional book and signing up for a short, weekly small group meeting. Our theme is *Good Enough*, inspired by the new devotional book by Kate Bowler and Jessica Ritchie, *Good Enough:* 40ish Devotionals for a Life of Imperfection. We'll be embracing the imperfections of life and faith during the season, as we hear the stories of Jesus in Luke's gospel.



I'm usually a skimmer. I visit my well multiple times a day and feel confident of God's presence. Recently, however, I've had to look deeper to find God in the midst of our crazy world.

As I struggle to make sense of all the chaos, clashing, and conflict, I see God in the kindness of others, and this fills my well.

Whatever your faith journey has been, I pray you go to the well of faith when necessary and receive nourishment from God. Our church has been blessed throughout the pandemic. 
# MISSION GRANT UPDATE

FPCRO received a generous grant from a friend of the church to serve God's mission in the world during 2022. We want to keep you updated on the three projects and invite you to get involved with whichever one most speaks to you.

- 1. Refugee Resettlement—Samaritas is matching FPCRO with an Afghan family who is already in Michigan. Activities should be gearing up in February as our team seeks out suitable housing for their family in a location that makes sense for them (culturally, access to public transportation, etc.). Then we'll help furnish the home and stock the kitchen and cupboards. We'll ensure their children are enrolled in school, they're getting to doctor's appointments, and seeking out next steps toward creating their new life in the United States. Contact Benny Rediers or Ted DeVantier to get involved. Opportunities are available for driving the family to appointments, tutoring, English conversation and lots of other ways to love these new neighbors.
- 2. Children's Library and Play Space—A team of folks met at the end of January to begin dreaming up the specifics of this project (location in the church, furnishings, contents of library, etc.). They will continue to put their plans down on paper and then move toward build out of the space and purchasing the appropriate items. There's still time to get involved and share your ideas! Contact Pastor Emma for more info.
- 3. South Oakland Citizens for the Homeless-In February, we expect to disburse funds to SOCH to help support their social worker in a 12-month contract (instead of just a four month contract during the winter). The social worker is instrumental in the roll-out of their new Welcome Home program which seeks to transition a small number of well-qualified Welcome Inn guests into permanent housing. As the program develops, we anticipate opportunities for church members to help participants with life skills such as budgeting, cooking, and searching for jobs.

# SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- The elders continued HIGHU discussion their of scripture passages that represent our church's story in our current time. This month, they read Matthew 5:14-16 and explored what it means to be the light of the world.
- A proposal from National Restoration was approved to restore, clean, tuckpoint, and repaint the lettering on the large stone sign on the Hendrie side of the church.
- · An updated version of the FPCRO Comprehensive Investment Policy was approved.
- · Elders reviewed the Annual Statistical Report for the PC(USA). Among other data, it includes information on our membership, finances, and mission giving. Current membership stands at 385.

# FEBRUARY H.O.M.E. PROJECT



**Sunday, February 6** and should be returned to the church by **Sunday, February 27**. Diapers of all sizes may be purchased, and wipes may also be included. The bags will contain in addition to the guidance sheet with scripture, discussion topics and prayers, and information about The Natural Momma Me organization.

Having an adequate supply of clean diapers is essential in supporting the health, wellness and quality of life of babies through toddler-aged children. Due to the cost, many families are not able to keep an adequate supply of diapers. This is one way we can reach out to others and help. Other ways to help will be included in the information sheet. # **Sunflowers Christian Preschool**



Make jars of Italian barley soup to share love and warmth with friends.

### What you need:

- 1 cup pearled barley
- · 1/2 cup sundried tomatoes
- · 1 Tbsp dry minced garlic
- · 1 Tbsp dry minced onion
- 1 veggie bouillon cube
- Glass pint jars with lids
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Pen

### What you do:

- In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar.
- Trace the outline of the lid onto cardstock. Cut out.
- On the card, write these directions: Remove wrapper from bouillon cube. Add contents of jar to saucepan. Add 4 cups water and a can of diced tomatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce to low. Simmer about 20 minutes, until barley is tender. Serve with parmesan cheese.
- Place the card atop the lid. Screw on the canning ring to keep it in place.
