From the Pastor's Desk...

Friends,

February will have us moving quickly among lots of holidays and holy-days. We will dedicate our financial pledges and gifts to God on February 11 (which will then take effect on August 1). You might be celebrating Valentines Day on February 14, but we also hope you'll come to church at 7pm to mark Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the season of Lent. Some of these are celebrations that don't come easy to us. We might need to push ourselves a bit to participate and to realize why these days are important in our faith. Here are some fast facts about these days and why they matter to me and to the church.



Dedicating our financial pledges, February 11

Giving a portion of our resources to God is an important way we translate our head- and heartbeliefs into tangible actions. Giving our money away is a way we say to God, "you matter. My faith matters. And I'm willing to make a sacrifice to demonstrate it." Your gifts allow the church to do all our ministries, to care for those in need, and to share with our wider community. The church has suggestions on ways to give, which you'll see in the packet coming to your home. We can often increase our giving, but occasionally we might need to decrease it for a time, too. My family had to adjust our giving while my husband was in school, and we are pleased to increase it again this year now that he is working. Let your decision be guided by prayer and conversation. If I can be a partner in that, please let me know.

Being marked with ashes on Ash Wednesday, February 14

Some people believe this is a "Catholic" tradition, or they feel weird about receiving the sign of the cross in ashes on their forehead. But ashes are a symbol for all Christians that reminds us that, in the creation story, we were made from the dust/mud/ashes of the earth. And because we are human, our bodies will one day return there. Ash Wednesday invites us into a season of turning our lives toward God, recognizing places where we have drawn away from our faith, and seeking to come back to God's ways. The sign of ashes is a sobering and honest one. It also reminds us that God is the one who made us and from whom we are never separated because of Christ's love.

The season of Lent, February 14 until Easter on March 31

Lent is the 40 weekdays, plus Sundays, between Ash Wednesday and Easter. It's the extension of Ash Wednesday. Many people choose to give something up, or take on some new practice during the season. If you do that, I urge you to let it be something that grows your faith, and not simply a veiled New Year's resolution or diet trick.

Our church's theme for Lent is A Higher Calling: What Jesus Asks of Those Who Follow. We'll continue reading Mark's gospel and hear how Jesus asks a lot of his disciples. Faith can be costly and following him often asks us to make sacrifices, take risks, and do challenging things. But rather than be overwhelmed by that, we can explore the meaning and impact these actions give our lives. Our church's Epiphany star word for the year is *enlightenment*. I trust God will allow our hearts and minds to be enlightened by our exploration of this season.





LOCKING UP THE ALLELUIAS

On **Sunday, February 11** our Sunday school children will lock up the alleluias for the Lent season. For children, this is a



symbolic way to recognize the sadness of learning about Jesus' death. However, we also recognize what follows the sadness. That is the exciting news of Jesus' resurrection. It's important for children to remember what Lent is about, as well as what comes after it. Though we lock those alleluias away, let's not forget what is to come on the other side of the 'wilderness.' May those alleluias represent the hope that comes from Resurrection Sunday when we will shout and sing alleluia once again.

A Higher Caller: What Jesus Asks of Those Who Follow

Lent begins on **February 14, 2024**—40 days (plus Sundays) before Easter. This year, we'll read scriptures in Mark's gospel that show us the high calling of discipleship.



This kind of life is not for the faint of heart. Jesus asks much of those who follow him. And God's grace goes with us as we pursue the life of discipleship. Consider whether there is a spiritual practice you would like to take on during the season of Lent this year. Maybe joining the Lenten book study, taking a day of Sabbath each week, or something else.

Ash Wednesday service Feb 14 at 7pm

Join us to begin the season of Lent on **Wednesday, February 14 in the sanctuary at 7pm**. The service will include the imposition of ashes and will be livestreamed.



If you cannot attend the service, you are welcome to visit the church between 9am and 2pm on Ash Wednesday to receive ashes.

LENT IN PLAIN SIGHT DISCUSSION GROUP

When Lent begins on **February 14**, join Pastor Emma in reading *Lent in Plain Sight: A Devotion Through Ten Objects* by Jill Duffield. Read one devotion per day, and gather at the church for discussion of each week's readings on **Wednesdays from 1pm**-



2pm, February 14 through March 27. God is often at work through ordinary people and objects. These devotions highlight ordinary objects Jesus would have encountered on his way to Jerusalem: dust, bread, the cross, coins, shoes, oil, coats, towels, thorns, and stones. As we follow the Biblical account of Jesus' final days, we will find meaning in the ordinary corners of our lives, as well. Order your book now so you'll be ready for Lent.



- We were gifted around \$24,000 in Memorial Gifts in memory of loved ones. In addition to individual loved ones gifts, children/relatives of congregation members have gifted funds from the estate to the church because it was such an important part of the deceased person's life. The families of Michael and Martha Cameron, Jackie Davis, Barbara Luttrell, Russell and Virginia Valbusch, and Annette Watson have recently done so.
- FPCRO holds a dear place in the hearts of some of our former members long after they leave and we have been surprised when gifts are received. Recent examples from former members include being the beneficiary on the 401(k) plan of David Schmidt, being a recipient from the Cameron Trust from Martha Cameron, and receiving a bequest of Carolyn and Milton Kevreson to the music fund.
