From the Pastor's Desk...

Friends,

This season feels very Lent-y to me. Many among us are carrying difficult challenges, experiencing deep loss, or facing worries about the future. I also find the return to a presidential election year a bit wearying, even as I strongly believe in the need to participate in our democratic process. And even if ongoing wars cease, the upheaval, death, and destruction they leave in their wake will not. What can people of faith do in the face of all that?

At the simplest, we can do things that constitute gratitude and discipleship: checking in on loved ones, being honest and caring with people who are struggling without papering over their sorrow with platitudes, donating money to causes that contribute to the



common good. We can speak honestly, but listen with even more openness, when we talk about difficult issues. We can pray, bring food to those who need it, and make sure we are working toward peace in our own small families and communities.

As we journey toward Holy Week and Easter, we also prepare ourselves to encounter the stories of Jesus' betrayal, arrest, and crucifixion. Those are not easy stories to live with either. We sometimes don't know what to do with them, just as we don't know what to do with the hard things in our lives. When it all feels overwhelming, we can zero in on one thing Jesus shared with his disciples, what we often call the "love commandment." On Maundy Thursday, Jesus said, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." When we don't know what else to do, we can act with love.

A short poem from Emily Dickinson, "I had no time to Hate," encourages us toward love.

I had no time to Hate—
Because
The Grave would hinder Me—
And Life was not so
Ample I
Could finish—Enmity—
Nor had I time to Love—
But since
Some Industry must be—
The little Toil of Love—
I thought
Be large enough for Me—
~Emily Dickinson



Applications Due March 31



A HIGHER CALLER: WHAT JESUS ASKS OF THOSE WHO FOLLOW



Scholarships for Student in Education

Each year, the Detroit Area Chapter of Pi Lambda Theta (an international educational honor society), awards 10 scholarships of \$2,500 to students in education at any Michigan college or university who will be doing their student teaching in the next school year.

Below are the six requirements (which were written when the scholarship was established). They are:

- 1. A GPA of 3.5 or above
- 2. A statement of need
- 3. Two references
- 4. A copy of an official student transcript
- 5. Explanation of a volunteer project for his/her community or house of worship
- 6. Innovative ideas for their classrooms

Most teacher preparation programs require two studentteaching placements, during which time the students is not allowed to work, yet still has to pay for the total of 14 credit hours for the two semesters involved. This scholarship aims to offer the financial assistance needed during the student-teaching period.

Grounds Maintenance

Everything outside of the church building, including the garage, is considered "grounds" and thus falls under grounds expenses.

Fun Facts:

- We contract our lawn maintenance and snow removal to Total Lawn Care, and our weeding to Ellen's Gardening. Last summer, weekly cutting and trimming of our grass cost \$85. We pay on an hourly basis for weeding of the garden beds.
- Our snow removal and salting contract is an annual cost of \$13,500. We pay this rate no matter how many snowfalls we get during the winter. Typically, we find this is to our advantage when there is average or above snowfall.
- Minor parking lot repairs and patching are budgeted in our annual general operating budget. By patching and re-striping our parking lots on a regular basis, we can lengthen the times between when it needs asphalt.
- Boy Scouts Dan Kline and Aiden Davis chose the FPCRO garage for their Eagle Scout project. Dan changed boards and painted the exterior, and Aiden helped clear the contents and build shelves in the interior.
