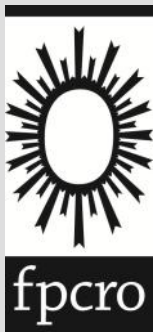

Children Belong Here

There is a place for families and children of all ages here! We believe children who worship with their church family stick with their faith for a lifetime. Choose what works best for your family:

- The *Prayground* in the back of the sanctuary, where children may do quiet activities, with you nearby to assist, as they absorb the worship service. Third graders and older are encouraged to sit with their family in the pews.
- The **Backyard Playroom** is a free program offering a safe, indoor environment for children ages five (5) and under to play under parental/guardian supervision, and is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9am to 12pm.
- Sunday School: Following the Time with Children, kids may go with Sunday school leaders to class, which ends at the conclusion of the worship service.
- Nursery: Childcare for infants and toddlers during the 10:30am service, with background-checked staff and volunteers.

Finding Your Way

Kirkman Fellowship Hall: Use either staircase in the lobby to go downstairs into the Hall. *Nursery:* Located to the right of the lobby, down the hallway across from the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. *Elevator:* Down the hall, left past the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. *Restrooms:* Women's & Men's are at the top of the short stairwells in the lobby; All Gender/Single in the narthex outside the sanctuary; Accessible is at the end of the hallway near the Fireside Room. *Hearing-assist devices:* Ushers near the sanctuary doors are available to assist you.







Volunteer at Forgotten Harvest—Weekday and Weekend Opportunities

The Mission in Service committee is offering two kinds of opportunities to volunteer at Forgotten Harvest (15000 W Eight Mile, Oak Park). FH collects and delivers thousands of pounds of surplus food weekly to alleviate hunger and end food waste by providing nutritious food to families facing food insecurity. The Warehouse on 8 Mile is where we help pack rescued food from businesses to prevent food waste. We bundle food into sizable portions for food pantries, soup kitchens and individual families. The second opportunity is Client Choice Mobile Pantry (next to the Warehouse) This is a small venue where the volunteers help guests make food selections, much like shopping in a grocery store!
