### From the Pastor's Desk...

### Friends,

As people, we like marking time. We hang calendars on the wall and set them on our desks. They are critical pieces of our digital devices. From the youngest age, we teach children the days of the week and the months of the year. We mark the passing of time with birthdays and anniversaries.

This marking of time can be holy. For children, their birthday is just about the best day of the year. As we age, we may not relish each birthday celebration, but we usually say that it beats the alternative. Some anniversaries of life events are painful, even as they are important. Our newest Presbyterian hymnal, called *Glory to God*, has a whole section of hymns for "Celebrating Time." As Christians,



we believe that every moment is a gift from God. And so, we can celebrate time by giving thanks for the past and having confidence that God holds the future.

This month, our church gets to mark an important anniversary with our Parish Associate, the Rev. Neeta Nichols. Fifty years ago this month, she was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the northern church pre-cursor denomination to the Presbyterian Church (USA). At that time, she had been called to serve as Associate Pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Adrian, Michigan. Her ordination took place during their regular Sunday morning worship service on World Communion Sunday, October 7, 1973. We are excited to celebrate her 50th "ordiversary" together on World Communion Sunday in 2023—October 1! Please join us to offer a blessing for her in worship at the 10:30am service and a hearty congratulations and thanksgiving for her ministry at the Fellowship Coffee Hour that day. (There'll be cake and gluten free goodies, along with all the baked goods to purchase from On the Rise Bakery!)

Neeta was a pioneer for women in ministry. In 1972, there were only about 50 women ordained in the Presbyterian Church. By the end of 1973, that number had tripled and she was among them. She has broken barriers that women ministers in my generation have not (as often) had to consider. Because of women like her, I never thought twice that God was calling me to serve. Because of women like her, I am able to be your pastor today.

Ordination is special for everyone who is blessed and sent to serve through it: deacons, elders, and pastors. As Presbyterians, we are clear that ordination is not a special status, it represents a commissioning for a particular kind of service. It reminds us of the kind of life we have committed to lead and the God we have been called to serve. Neeta has served faithfully and well for so many years, living out her commitments to follow Jesus Christ, love neighbors, and to serve with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love. As a young minister who met Neeta in my first year of ministry, I am especially grateful that she has lived out her ordination promise to "be a friend among your colleagues."

As we mark this important moment in time together, I hope you will celebrate Neeta, but also all the ways you have been called to serve God at various times in your own life. And that you can give thanks!



Are you feeling called to learn more about our church or are you considering becoming a member? We would love to have you participate in our New Member Class. We will explore





It's been a wonderful beginning to our Sunday school season! We welcome familiar faces and new friends. Our Curriculum,




Living the Word, follows the same scripture explored in worship. This creates a great opportunity for children and their grown-ups to share in conversation about how they experience the Word of God.

## FALL BOOK DISCUSSION

### Get Your Book and Save the Date for Nov 8

During 2023-24, Pastor Emma will lead several book discussions focused around the themes of our church's Matthew 25 commitment. That commitment entails working to end structural racism, eliminate systemic poverty, and act as a vital congregation in our community.



On November 8 at 7pm, we'll meet in the Fireside Room to talk about Filled to be Emptied: The Path to Liberation for Privileged People by Brandan J. Robertson. You can buy a copy of the paperback book, or read it on your Kindle. This book is part Bible study, part invitation to self-reflection, and part theological work. Robertson traces the Kenosis Hymn-a short passage in the book of Philippians 2:5-11-which describes the way Christ emptied himself of power to become humble in service to God. Readers are invited to consider how we can choose humility by thinking differently about the various privileges we carry. The book touches on race and poverty, among other issues, and is an invitation to people across the spectrum to faithfully consider our own lives in relation to our wider community. It is highly readable and offers a fresh perspective. If you would like to read a copy, but purchasing one is hard for you, simply contact Pastor Emma.

### Save the Date — On the Rise Bakery!



A Program of the Capuchin Scorp Kitchen

On **Sunday, October 1**, after the 10:30am worship service, On the Rise Bakery will be selling baked goods. Goodies such as bread, cookies, muffins, pies, and cakes, ranging in price from \$2 to \$8, will be available for purchase. In purchasing their baked goods, you are helping make possible the provision of supportive housing, training, counseling services, educational opportunities, and selfhelp programs. On the Rise Bakery is a program where each man is responsible to reach back and support the newest member.

On the Rise Bakery and R.O.P.E. (Reaching Our Potential Everyday) are two of the many programs of the Capuchin Soup Kitchen. The R.O.P.E. Program provides men who have been incarcerated or completed a Substance Use Disorder Program a way to "re-enter" society by training them in baking skills. The extended residential program offers the opportunity for them to develop abilities that will solidify their sobriety, further their education, and hone their life skills.

Forgotten Harvest is fighting hunger and food insecurity in Metro Detroit by picking up food from over 520 food donors. Volunteers then clean and repack food into familysized portions which are distributed to families in Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties. Their team delivers 144,000 pounds of surplus food per day to local charities.

### WHAT IS PER CAPITA?

This year our congregation pays a per capita amount of \$36 per member to the Presbyterian Church USA. The yearly gift is given to allow every church the ability to engage in shared activities and to connect to the universal church. Like a family, we share costs to demonstrate unity. One of our missions is to connect to other Presbyterian churches; we create a more equitable communal relationship as Jesus taught us *"to love your neighbor as yourself"* (Matthew 22:39). We give to this fund to increase our effort of helping people around the world. Per capita is not retained by our individual church, but given to the larger church in ministry to the world.
